Our first homework Staff Car Park

A big reminder that the staff car park is precisely that - a staff car park. We don't have capacity to allow parents to use it, and we rely on parents not using it as part of our safety management plan - the car park has a natural bleed into the playground area next to the pupil entrance, so we don't want to increase traffic in this area especially at drop-off and pickup times when there are a lot of children around. We should also be respectful to our neighbours who reside on Quarry Road. They regularly report instances of poor driving, or their driveways / access points being blocked by vehicles which shouldn't be trying to get into our car park in the first place.

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## **Swimming**

Now that the Minorca Hill road closure is in effect the closest bus stop that we can use is located at the top of the hill. This makes it more challenging in terms of staffing the various swimming groups which now include a walk to and from the school building. The following solution will be applied to enable children's swimming lessons to still go ahead: We will take one group (made

up of two classes) swimming each side of Christmas. From this coming Tuesday until the end of term Year 3 and Year 6 will swim. After Christmas until February Year 4 and Year 5 will swim. They will have a longer session in the pool to compensate for not going both half-terms and we are confident this means that they achieve the same amount of

opportunity to swim as usual. Everyone will return to swimming altogether after February half-term. This plan

means that we can adequately staff the walk to and from the bus stop, the bus journey and the swimming sessions.
