

## Writing Challenges

### **Writing Challenge 1:** Pobble: The King of Winter

Read the story opener and have a go at continuing the story. Think about WHO could potentially put a stop to the eternal winter. Try to include descriptive phrases to describe your setting and character.

Extension: Improve the sick sentence for The King of Winter.

### **Writing Challenge 2:** Common letter strings with different pronunciations

Open the document for Writing Challenge 2. Copy out the words for each question and underline the word that has the same letter string but a different pronunciation to the other options.

(For example: dove, cove, love).

### **Writing Challenge 3:** Pobble: The Glass House

Read the story opener and have a go at the 'sentence challenge'. Can you complete the 'ly' sentences and have a go at thinking of 5 of your own 'ly' adverbs as sentence starters.

How is the problem resolved and do the two mysterious characters get what they came for?

**Writing Challenge 10:** Save the Rhinos persuasive poster

Open Challenge 10 and create your own persuasive poster that persuades people to 'Save the Rhinos'. Include a picture with your persuasive argument. Think of 3 reasons why people should try to protect the rhinos and include them in your writing. Include the features of persuasive writing (rhetorical questions, repetition, alliteration). Your final draft should be well presented and colourful.
