# School Closure Home Learning Reception

## Dear Parents/Carers,

We provide a wide range of learning to the children in our schools. It would be impossible to deliver and replicate that in the home environment. However, we want children to have the opportunity to continue learning whilst the schools are closed. So, we have put together learning packs with tasks/activities that can be completed at home. Some learning guidelines are listed below including online links where you can find extra ideas and games.

#### **Phonics**

Continue to practise the sound mats that your child has been provided with. Hide some tricky words around the house for them to find and read.

# Reading

Keep up with reading as much as possible. They can read their favourite books, talk about the story, what the characters did and why, predict what they think will happen next. Whatever they read is great. Just reading keeps that skill going!

## Handwriting

Letter formation- Work on the correct formation of the letters and practise writing their name.

## Maths

- Counting to 20
- Addition to 10
- Counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Go on a shape hunt around the house/garden. Which 2D and 3D shapes can you identify?
- Go on a number hunt around the house/garden. Which numbers can you see?
- Number formation to 10

#### Art

- Draw a portrait of someone in the house
  - look carefully at their faces, shape of face, eyes, nose and mouth. Where does the nose sit on the face? What shape are the eyes? What is the hair like?
- Observe and draw spring flowers



## Science

- Floating and Sinking
- Investigate objects around the home/garden that float and sink.
- Create a boat that floats See how resourceful you can be around your home to make the house e.g twigs from the garden for the mast
- Bake and chat about
