Welcome to Laxey Primary School

Laxey Primary School is located in the heart of Laxey Village. The people of Laxey play a big part in the school and we strive to be an active contributor to the community. We provide education for children from the ages of 4 - 11, Reception to Year 6.

Laxey School is part of a Federation with the Dhoon School, located just 4.5 miles away. As a Federated school we operate differently to other schools on the Island. Maxim Kelly is the Executive Headteacher at both Laxey and the Dhoon School and oversees the planning and strategic operations at both schools. Craig Astin is the Head of School at Laxey and takes lead in organising and running the school on a daily basis.

The School takes pride in our vision to create an environment where everyone feels valued and has equal opportunities to thrive. We believe in a growth mindset teaching style and encourage children to instill these learning habits into their daily lives. All of the staff believe in this philosophy, understanding that every child can learn and succeed with the right attitude, guidance and support.

In our most recent inspection (November 2018) we were validated as 'Very Effective'. Since this report we have continued to develop our strengths and build on any of our weaknesses.

One area we are particularly focusing on is creating stronger partnerships with parents, carers, other professionals and the wider community. Here are some of the comments from the last parent questionnaire:

Early Years Foundation Stage

- Safe and nurturing, high quality learning environment
- Multi sensory learning experience for the children both inside and outside of the classroom

Key Stage 1

- In Key Stage One children are provided with a broad and balanced curriculum through a range of exciting and engaging learning activities in and outside of the classroom
- Develop and foster positive attitude towards learning, valuing all contributions whilst meeting their individual needs
- At the core of Key Stage One the children will be developing their literacy, phonics and numeracy skills. The children will learn these skills through a fostering of enjoyment, perseverance and determination to succeed



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Key Stage 2



- The Education journey continues, further developing skills across the curriculum
- English lessons have an emphasis on grammatical features and precise sentence structure. Lessons include opportunities to appreciate and understand a wide range of classic and modern literature
- Purposeful links are made across the curriculum areas with Manx themes embedded into the children's learning
- A greater emphasis on formal efficient methods in calculation, applying them to problem solving and reasoning activities
- Strong focus on English and Maths
- The expectations in Key Stage 2 are always high, supported by strong teaching methods, clear communication about the quality of work expected, assessment that informs areas of improvement and support through extension activities designed to further challenge the children
- The curriculum is delivered through direct formal teaching with independent learning opportunities and collaboration encouraged

School Uniform

Our pupils wear school uniform from Reception to Year 6. Maroon school sweatshirts, featuring the school logo, should be worn over white or blue polo shirts.

Polo shirts may be plain or with the school logo. They are worn with grey school trousers or shorts, tunics or skirts. Both boys and girls should wear black/dark school style shoes. In the summer, girls may wear red or yellow checked cotton dresses.

For PE and Games all children require shorts, a T-shirt and plimsolls/trainers. During colder weather they may wish to bring tracksuits, or jogging trousers and a sweatshirt, for outdoor activities.

Every Friday we host a Celebration Assembly where all children and staff attend. During this assembly we present the children with 'Learning Hero' or 'Magic Moment' certificates. Both certificates are linked to our vision and learning habits we use on a daily basis.

Magic Moment certificates are awarded to children for one off magical moments in relation to their learning. For example, a child may have sustained effort for a long time with some really challenging maths work.

Learning Hero certificates are awarded to children for demonstrating a consistent attitude towards learning over a period of time. For example, a child who always challenges themselves with their learning, becoming a positive role model with a great attitude towards learning.

As we are an inclusive school we are very mindful that children learn at different stages to each other. We don't award certificates because of a child's attainment, instead we present a child with an award when they have done something exceptional for them. Staffroom Invasion

 The Learning Heroes from each week are invited to join the staff during Friday morning play to have a hot chocolate, biscuit and chat.

This is a great opportunity for the children to meet other members of staff and discuss why they have achieved their award.

Class of the Fortnight





 Every other Monday the children in the school gather in the sports hall for the Class of the Fortnight assembly. Each class has a jar and teachers will award children a 'Magic Bean' if they are being safe, ready and respectful. These beans help the children to model positive behaviours in the school and promote good manners and etiquette at all times.

The Class of the Fortnight get an extra play time that week as well as a class book for their choosing with their Class Teacher.
